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Christophe Courtin is a full professor of Food Biochemistry at the Laboratory of Food Chemistry and Biochemistry at KU Leuven, Belgium. His research focuses on cereal constituents, the enzymes that degrade them and microorganisms in cereal processing. The emphasis is on a basic understanding of the structure and properties of these constituents and their technological and health functionality in cereal-based processes and products. Expertise and an extensive network in this area have been built up over the past two decades supervised PhDs, 42 projects and (inter)national through collaborations. He participated in EU projects in four consecutive Framework Programmes, and coordinates HealthFerm, a Horizon Europe 23 partner project. Recently, he (co-)organized the 8th Dietary Fibre Conference (2022) and the 20th EYCST Workshop (2023). He authored 330 peer-reviewed papers (15,700 citations, hindex: 66). He is co-inventor of 12 patent families. Recent awards he received are the Harald Perten Prize and the Belfort Lecture Award (Purdue University). He is the current vice-dean of his faculty.
